SEPTEMBER 2019 NEWSLETTER

LEAF PICK-UP: Please put your leaves (only leaves, no brush) by the edge of the road, not in the road or covering drainage ditches or catch basins. We will pick up leaves until the first snowfall or by Nov. 18th. After November 18th leaves must be placed in **biodegradable bags only**.

BUILDING INSPECTOR: Fall is an excellent time to have your chimney cleaned and checked before using your fireplace or pellet stove. Please remember to change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. Air filters in furnaces need annual replacement too. Adding insulation and sealing air leaks can reduce heating costs.

HUNTING: Hunting of any kind is prohibited in the Village of Lima (Local Law #5 of 2007).

ELECTRONIC RECYCLING: From time to time our congressmen and senators sponsor an Electronic Recycling event. When we are notified of this it will be posted on our web site. LOCAL LAW #1 OF 2019: A Public Hearing was held at the Village Board meeting of Aug. 13, 2019 and Local Law #1 was adopted. Any water or sewer accounts unpaid by the re-levy date will be assessed an additional \$25.00 /quarter. (EX. One unpaid water and two unpaid sewers, then an additional \$75.00 would be assessed on the village taxes). The re-levy date will be published in the December newsletter. Please be mindful of it as we cannot accept payments after the re-levy date.

SIDEWALK CONNECTION PROJECT: The Village has secured a \$551,000.00 grant from the Federal Highway Administration to construct new sidewalk connections in the village. Initial plans include new sidewalk installations on Buell Ave., College St., Dalton Rd., Dublin St., Elm St., Livingston St., Meadowview DR., and Michigan Ave. The project is in the preliminary design phase with construction slated to begin in the spring of 2021. Village residents will have several opportunities to provide input during the project.

WATER SYSTEM UPGRADES: In our effort to provide Village residents with safe and reliable water, we will perform the work listed below to upgrade our water system. The total cost of this project is \$4.3 million. The Village has secured \$2.6 million in New York State grants that will pay for 60% of the cost.

Phase I: Replacement of Pumps and Controls at our Rochester Street. pump (completed)

Phase II: Installation of an emergency water main to Avon (work to begin fall 2019). This new 12" water pipe will provide an emergency source of water in the event that we have a catastrophic failure in our pump station or transmission line on Rochester Street.

Phase III: Sanding, painting, and structural repairs to our water tower (to begin spring 2020).

Phase IV: Water main, valve, and hydrant replacements (to begin summer 2020).

New water mains, shut-off valves, and fire hydrants will be installed on the following sections of Village streets: Rochester St. (from Ziegler Dr. to Main St.), Seneca Ave. (west of Rochester St.), Maplewood Ave. (west of Rochester St.), College St.(from Elm St. to Mill St.), Lake Ave. (from Main St. to Community Dr.).
